

Art Term Lottery!

- Draw a slip of paper with the name of an art element or design principle.
- Look through classroom books and magazines. Find a work that makes strong use of your chosen art element or design principle – it should dominate the work.
- Write down the artist's name and, if given: title of work, date, media (what it's made out of), and size (specify units). A little sketch of the piece would be awesome.
- Describe the physical characteristic/s of the work that make you think it's a definitive example of your art term.
- If your art term is an element of art (line shape etc.), state the principle/s of design that seem to guide its use.
- If your art term is a principle of design (pattern contrast etc.), make sure to state the element/s of art that it's applied to.
- Do this for two more works, making sure that they are by different artists.

Be ready to present to the class your two choices and what makes them good examples of your art term.
