Color Investigation

Look up a color wheel online for reference if you need to.

- Complementary colors = colors opposite each other on the color wheel (e.g. blue and orange).
- Analogous colors = colors next to each other on the color wheel (e.g. red, red-violet, violet).
- Monochrome colors = one color (e.g. all blues).
- 1. Create a document of some sort to turn in.
- 2. Find three good examples of photos that make strong use of <u>complementary colors</u>. Include each photo in your document. Below each photo, write the names of the complementary colors (red and green, etc.)
- 3. Do the same thing for analogous colors,
- 4. Do the same thing for monochrome colors (not black and white!)
- 5. Do the same thing for photos that use a "pop of color" (e.g. a blue bike parked against a brown fence, a woman in bright clothes walking through a crowd of dull-suited businessmen, etc.) You do not have to write the name/s of the color/s. AVOID USING "SELECTIVE COLOR" EXAMPLES, where the image has been made monochrome or black and white except for certain parts! These are HORRIBLY cliché.
